

A Summary of Mem-ExSpan Students and How the Program Affected Their Futures  
Fifteen to Twenty-Five Years Later.

This is a set of **30 clients** I taught personally in small groups of 3-5. What happened to them? The outcome is shown 15-25 yrs. later. Pre- and post training cognitive skills tests were administered using The Woodcock-Johnson Pscho-Educational Cognitive Skills Battery, The Test of Cognitive Skills (TCS), The Learning Efficiency Test, and The Detroit Tests of Learning Aptitude. This is an unusual group, as many entered at low levels with cognitive deficiencies, and these weaknesses were corrected. Was Mem-ExSpan training a coincidence of this high success outcome level? Or rather, would these *results of being at the top of their career have happened without BTA training?*

<p>My first class consisted of my own three children plus the son of friends who urged that I help them, as I was a public school Learning Disability teacher. I replied, "OK, I'll form a class with my kids." What happened to them career-wise? The friend, a college English teacher, also took the class later for herself, and she also donated a tuition for her Godchild. All had high success rates. Subsequent enrollees also made strong improvements, and the ones that could be tracked all had gainful employment as teachers, realtors, fire fighters, business consultants, film directors, etc. Yet, the following unique 30 cases were quite interesting as a few entered as Gifted, others Low.
